

This example is showing you how to use APA intext Referencing Style.

You will notice that when I want to include a quotation I will place it in double inverted commas like this example and then follow it with a citation. “It’s clear, right from the beginning of the Bible that God created us to be attached to others” (Clinton & Straub, 2010, p. 12). Other times I might want to paraphrase or summarise a text. If that is the case I do not need to put the information in double inverted commas since it is not an exact copy, but I still need to reference it. For example, Grenz (2000, pp. 112-113) agrees that God’s valuing of community and relationship is a central theme in the narrative of Scripture and is seen right from the start of the Bible in Genesis 2.

Walton (2012, p. 11) also argues that the importance placed in the creation story on relationships is valid; that both men and women are “equal in [God’s] sight by virtue of creation”. This should be an encouragement to us all!
